

SCIENTOLOGY SUCKS



ISSAC HAYES

Isaac Hayes III recently clarified that his father, Isaac Hayes, did not voluntarily quit South Park in 2006. At the time, Hayes had suffered a serious stroke and was in no condition to make such decisions. According to his son, his resignation was issued by his Scientology handlers without his father's consent. Hayes III emphasized that his father loved the show and the character of Chef, and had no issues with its satirical style. Hayes III also said that, without the steady income from South Park, his father had to return to touring before he was fully recovered from his stroke. He believes this took a serious toll on Hayes's health and contributed to his decline.



LISA MCPHERSON

In December 1995, Lisa McPherson, a 36-year-old Scientologist, died after 17 days in isolation under the Church of Scientology's care at its Fort Harrison Hotel in Clearwater, Florida. Following a minor car accident, McPherson exhibited erratic behavior – stripping naked in public – and was briefly hospitalized. She declined psychiatric care under church influence and was taken by Scientologists for an “Introspection Rundown,” a controversial practice meant to handle mental distress without psychiatry. During her confinement, she was severely dehydrated, malnourished, and covered in insect bites. She died of a pulmonary embolism caused by extreme dehydration while being driven to a distant hospital. Her death led to criminal charges against the church, later dropped, and a wrongful death lawsuit, settled in 2004.



LISA MARIE PRESLEY

Lisa Marie Presley was involved with the Church of Scientology for much of her life, having been introduced to it by her mother, Priscilla Presley, in the 1970s. She became a prominent member and even advocated for the Church publicly at times. However, by the mid-2000s, Lisa Marie began to distance herself, eventually leaving Scientology around 2012. In later interviews and private emails that became public, she criticized the Church for its authoritarian structure, emotional manipulation, and efforts to isolate members from outside influences. She alleged that Scientology tried to control her personal relationships and contributed to family estrangement, including pressure to disconnect from people deemed “suppressive.” Her departure reportedly caused significant internal backlash, and she described the process of leaving as extremely difficult and damaging, both emotionally and socially.
